FOR ME - AND WITH ME

We have entered the season of Lent. We are walking the Road to Calvary. We are examining the way we are living, the goals we have set, the dominating desires which govern our decisions, and the resources of strength which are available for us to depend on — all in the light of the Cross and Rising of the Lord Jesus. As I begin this journey again, it seems to me that two great truths have been given for me to travel by — like the pillar of cloud and the pillar of fire that led the People of God in the wilderness.

Sometimes God seems hostile. There is so much in my life of which I am ashamed that it seems impossible that God should want to do anything but reject me. Then the Cross of Jesus cries: "GOD IS FOR YOU. Your sins are forgiven. Christ died for sinners."

And sometimes God seems far away. My prayers seem hollow, my faith burns low, old anxieties and doubts creep back, my life is dark defeat. Then Easter dawns, and the voice cries: "GOD IS WITH YOU. Don't be afraid. It is I."

This is the good news; that the God who made me is on my side and at my side. For me and with me - this is the God of my life!

"If the love of Jesus had been less than perfect, He might have questioned at one point after another whether He had not gone far enough. Some few He had gained, and they might gain some others. But this question did not arise with Him. There could be no term to the Shepherd's search for His lost sheep 'until He found it'. He could not disown any who needed Him, and none needed

The Home, which is sponsored by some of our Chinese churches, houses some thirty old ladies, most of whom have been church workers or Bible-women in earlier days. Situated just off the Old Thomson Road — it must be noisy there when Grand Prix time comes round! — the Home is a very simple cluster of wood and attap kampong houses, but breathes a most happy and contented Christian atmosphere. We shall long remember the little service we shared in the tiny wooden chapel, when Mrs Goh Yeow of the Kampong Kapor Methodist Church spoke in Hokkien of 'The Good Shepherd'and our own Honeybees sang two musical numbers to the great delight of the old ladies.

The W.S.C.S. visited the Home for Retarded Children in Tampines Road on Saturday 19 February with gifts of food and clothing for the children.

It was meal time when we arrived, and we were able to help in feeding the children, most of whom are quite unable to look after themselves. We were deeply impressed by the dedication of the staff of the Home, for it must make great demands upon them to go on expressing their loving care and concern to their charges, many of whom have been totally written off by their own families.

One of the children is blind, many others are hopelessly crippled and have to be carried everywhere, one teenage girl crawls around on all-fours, and there is a pathetic little group of thirty— or forty—year olds who are still tiny children in all but age. The Home is a little pool of desperate human need. The buildings are very simple wood and wire—mesh barracks, but the low-lying site floods badly in wet weather, and the Association is planning new premises close to the Trafalgar Home.

It takes a very special kind of loving courage to live and work in such an environment, and we honour those who are doing this wonderful work. We were glad to hear that the University students

'Him more than those who disowned Him. Pilate could wash his hands of Jesus, but Jesus could not wash His hands of Pilate. He Himself said the only thing that could be said for His accusers - they knew not what they did. He knew.

"He went up to Jerusalem to challenge their sin. They in their turn challenged His love. When sin had flung its last dart and said its last word, He answered them from His Cross. If we may dare to say so, He there betrothed Himself for ever to the human race, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health. Seven words from the Cross are reported, but there was another, which said: "I will never leave you may forsake you"....That pledge stands for ever, and binds Him to our race in its deepest need....I may deny it; I may ignore it; I may never have heard of it; but it stands. If I sit in the House of the Lord, I may sing, "He loved me and gave Himself for me'. But if I choose to sit at the table of harlots, and steep myself in sin's delirium, it is still true that He loved me and gave Himself for me, and His presence I cannot escape.

"No man is now left alone in his sin. It pleased Him to join Himself for ever to our unworthy race and to contend with the sin that we love until we love it no longer. If to bear sin means to go where the sinner is, and to refuse either to leave him or to compromise with him; to love a shameful being and therefore to be pierced with his shame; to devote oneself utterly to his recovery, and to follow him with easeless ministries, knowing that he cannot be recovered without his consent, and that his consent may be indefinitely withheld - if this is to bear sin, then this is what Jesus did from first to last, what no other could do, and it is the innermost secret of the heart of God".

These quotations from W.R.Haltby's 'The Cross of Christ' express so beautifully what seems to me central to the message of this Holy season. It is my prayer that we may find this God of Love, who makes Himself known in Jesus, and know:

That I am His and He is mine, For ever and for ever!
