#### THE TESTIMONY OF THE MARTYRS

We enclose with copies of this Newsletter sent to church members, a pamphlet prepared by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who, it is hoped, will be visiting Singapore in September. Plans are being made for him to speak at the National Theatre, and further details will be given later when arrangements have been finalised.

Those who have read his book 'Tortured for Christ' will know what incredible suffering and privations this courageous man endured for fourteen years, in solitary confinement for his faith in Christ. It is a tale of Christ-empowered endurance that shatters our complacency and shames our comfortable respectability. In the tolerant atmosphere of Singapore, it is easy for us to forget that there are still so many fellow-Christians in the world whose commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ requires them quite literally to take their lives in their hands. Pastor Wurmbrand is determined to bring home to as many people as possible the true situation. His own experience and example, and his continuing concern for those who still suffer as he has done, make it plain that the call of Jesus to "take up your cross and come after me" is not simply to be brushed aside as a picturesque figure of speech. To some of our contemporaries it is an exact description of what Christian obedience may mean.

Following Jesus always means, in one way or another, being ready to put our lives on the line for what we believe; to affirm, in the brave words of Martin Luther, "My conscience stands captive to the word of God. Here I stand. I can do no other. So help me, God." In the long line of witnesses stand many noble souls, from Paul and Peter to the martyrs of our own day, and the name 'martyr' which we give to them is simply the Greek word for 'a witness'. For there is no testimony so compelling as that which so clearly affirms total conviction, total surrender, and a love for Christ that is stronger

than love for life itself. "The blood of the martyrs is a seed," cried the 2nd Century Christian leader Tertullian. "The more you destroy us, the more we multiply!" By the grace of God we are part of His Church through the once-for-all sacrifice of Christ on Calvary, and through the faithful testimony of ten thousand times ten thousand ordinary Christians, whose devotion to Him brought them to a final confrontation with the persecuting power of a hostile State.

Of course, the martyrs are special people - not by birth, or natural endowment, for some of the most conspicuous have been simple, ordinary folk; but in their certainty that the God who raises the dead is one from whom no power on earth can separate them. That glowing assurance undergirds them, and makes the impossible possible.

Not that they are perfect people (though certainly 'saints' in the Bible sense) for God does not need perfect people to be witnesses to His saving power. Sometimes they were misguided in certain of the opinions they held (though not in the conviction that obedience to the Lord of their lives must come before all other obediences). The fact of martyrdom is not in itself a demonstration of truth. Down the centuries people, Christian and non-Christian, have been prepared to die in the cause of error. Martyrdom is a demonstration of conviction, not of infallibility. There is always a danger that we may run away with the idea that a martyr is always right.

I do not wish to belittle the sacrifice of one like Pastor Wurmbrand. God forbid! But I cannot share his adamant opposition to the Ecumenical Movement as a pro-Communist organisation, even though I know it too has many flaws, weaknesses and errors. I deeply regret that one who has endured so much should sometimes be so divisive of the cause of Christian unity. I honour, for Christ's sake, the testimony of his faith; I differ from him in regard to some of the opinions he holds.

Let us, nevertheless, be uplifted by his witness. Let us work and pray for those still 'in bonds' for the testimony of Jesus. Let us be strengthened to 'run the race set before us' in the remembrance that we, no less than the first Christians, are surrounded by a 'cloud of witnesses' who have sealed their witness with their blood. God grant that we too may be ready to stand fast for Jesus!
