I should like to submit my application for your pulpit. I have been considered to be a fair speaker.

As for references, I am handicapped, I have not stayed in one place too long nor taught for too long, and the groups I preached to were really pretty small and they were generally not held in too high regard by many of the town.

As for me, the elders of my last church called me a drunkard and glutton and I am afraid that they disapproved of a large number of my friends.

References are a to be hard to come by. I am not sure that the people who could tell you most about me are the sort of people you want to hear from,

You will want to know what scrt of impression I have made in the places where I have been working. In some places we really had to run for we were by no means welcome, several times almost causing riots and certainly upheavels in the 'status quo'. At the last church, leaders got especially mad at me when I called them phonies', 'vipers' and hypocrites. I suppose you could say I really didn't get along with the religious leaders in my last town.

Really I can't get any references that you must want. I have been threatened many times. I'm not any good at administration. I can't keep records on things like new members, and all that

Chen Meng Sheng who is at the Institute of Social Studies in the Hague wrote recently from East Africa:

"Greetings from steaming hot Mombasa. I've been here in East Africa with the U.N. Development programme Team for the past 31 days. At the end of April, I'll go to Nairobi and then fly back to the Hague. I'll return to Singapore on 1st. July. I sure miss my family and the fellowship of Trinity Church. I went to a nearby Church here last Sunday — it's a Catholic one. I'm trying to locate a Methodist Church. Please convey my best

wishes to all the fine people (especially the Sunday School group and the M.Y.F.) of Trinity, too many to mention. I'll want to be involved in Sunday School teaching again when I return if it is not too fully staffed."

N.B. The Sunday School is not too fully staffed. (Hint!)

Victor Goh Hng Hang is in the Philippines as a full time worker with Campus Crusade for Christ (Address: P.O. Box 51, Quezon City, Philippines). He expects to be back in Singapore at the end of May:

"The schedule is getting herwier as the University term is drawing to an end. We have to bring our ministry to a peak and have to train at least one disciple to take over the work when we leave.

At present our singing team - the Cross Roads are performing here. I really want to thank the Lord for the possibility of having the 2 concerts at U.S.T. This in itself is a crusade. Last Friday and Saturday a total of 2,300 attended the concert out of which a few hundreds prayed to receive Christ including two professors. Early in March I had the opportunity to show a film (evangelistic film) to 1,000 of the students and 266 prayed to receive Christ. I was amazing to see how the Lord opens these doors.

It is my desire that not too long from now I can be really supported fully. This can only come about through Christian friends who love the Lord and would like to invest their money in my ministry.

The main stress in my ministry will be among the students and a bit in Churches. The main purpose will be to " ν 'u", "build", and "send" men to help fulfill the great commission.

When I worked among the Chinese in the Philippines the Lord began burdening my heart for Chinese scattered in many countries who are in desperate need of Chinese workers who are well trained. If God will send me to Red China when its door opens I would be ready."

The Outreach Committee is planning to send some regular financial support for Victor's work.

FIFTH ASSEMBLY OF THE EAST ASIA CHRISTIAN CONFERENCE

The EACC is comprised of churches in fifteen countries in the region reaching from Pakistan to Japan and to New Zealand. They are churches which confess the Lord Jesus Christ as God and Saviour according to the Scriptures and they seek to fulfill their common calling to the One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.National Councils or similar bodies which belong also are bound by this confession.

The Fifth Assembly will be held in Singapore from 6th. to 12th. June, 1973,

Appropriately themed, "CHRISTIAN ACTION IN THE ASIAN STRUGGLE", the Assembly will feature a keynote address by Dr. M.M.Thomas, Director, Christian Institute for the Study of Religion and Society (CISRS) of India and three Niles Memorial lectures which will set forth the possibilities of Christian action in the Asian struggle for justice, liberation and development. The presentation of sub-themes will bring to the Assembly for consideration, thrusts and priorities of Christian action programmes for the next 4 years.

POA PAYOH METHODIST CHURCH PROJECT

Because of rainy weather and the recent shortage of building raterials the building work could not be completed by Easter as promised by the contractor. However the construction work is progressing smoothly and steadily and it is hoped that the Dedication Service can be conducted on 22nd. June, 1973, the very day the tender was submitted two years ago. We are glad to inform you that today, the total amount pledged is slightly more than \$1,000,000/-.

Two full time workers are carrying out Christian out-reach programmes in Toc Payoh; and the monthly expences including their salaries and C.P.F. come to some \$1,500/-. The S.M.A.C. Churches in the Singapore District have pledged to bear to bear one half of the financial responsibility for 1973 Conference Year.

Although the Executive Committee of the MCTPPC had decided to close the Building Fund Account, it is hoped that donors will contimue to support the project by giving generously towards the General Fund or the Endowment Fund for carrying out the programmes and activities in Toa Payoh.

The new church hopes that members of other Methodist congregations are resident in Toa Payoh will be associating themselves actively with the witness and programme of the Toa Payoh Methodist thurch for a period of one year. At the end of this term of service, they would then be free to decide whether to transfer membership to the new church or to remain within the fellowship of their original congregation. MONG THE SENGOI VILLAGES

Extracts from a letter just received from Bah War, a Christian Sengoi boy who is at present under training at the MIRI Bible Sollege.

"Thank you for the encouraging news, concerning the training course for Sengoi lay leaders at Kampar. I never thought that this braining would be carried out even now, because Dr. & Mrs. Means had gone home and no one would be able to lead the meetings and the Training Course. However, I kept thinking about the matter, asking the Lord to choose the right person to work for His people.

So, a few days ago when I received your letter saying that Bah Rahu has come back to serve the Lord, my heart was filled with JOY. Why? Because I acknowledge that God has chosen him to work among his own people and this might give greater encouragement to those Sengoi Workers and church members because they now have such an able man to lead them to God. So let us pray for him and that he may carry out the work not by his own will and ability, but of God's knowledge and understanding. I believe that work often fails, if one tries to do with only his/her own understanding and knowledge. We as children of God should learn to be obedient to His word and help those who are in need.

... About my present situation, well, I should say there is no problem except a shortage of finance. I need various things, especially books beside my clothing. For one year, I haven't bought any clothing except the year before last when I had made only one pair of trousers and that is all.

...For the last two terms, I really praised the Lord that He has provided enough money to pay for my food expences etc. The Lord has provided me an opportunity to work at "Tractors Malaysia Berhad", Miri where I worked for 3 weeks and that was how I was able to pay for my food expenses."
