PASTOR'S MESSAGE

MISSING THE POINT

A recent editorial in the 'Sunday Times' commenting on a speech by one of our political leaders, quoted the words of Jesus (Mark 12:17):

'Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and unto God the things that are God's.'

Unfortunately, the words were used to support the argument that religion and politics belong to two different spheres, and that each should allow the other to go its own way.

This is certainly an argument which has been used at different times of Church's history, but surely it misses the central point of Christ's reply. He is not suggesting that God has authority over one part of the world or one area of human life, while Caesar has authority over another part. There is no way of dividing human life and saying: "This is Caesar's; this is God's." When once we affirm "There is no God but God", we are saying "All life is answerable to him." And therefore "what is Caesar's" is also God's. "You would have no authority over me," says Jesus to Pontius Pilate, "if it had not been given to you from on high" (John 19:11).

The authority of the State is God-given - but not absolute. Political power must be responsible power - answerable to the God who gives it. Equally, the exercise of our citizenship must be responsible. We must acknowledge the authority God has given to the State for the maintenance and ordering of society - and individuals, no less than governments, are responsible for the ways in which they exercise the political powers they have been

METHODIST CHURCH TOA PAYOH PROJECT

A Message from the District Superintendent - Rev. T.C. Nga

Exactly two years ago, we submitted our tender for the piece of land 63,055 square feet at \$320,000/-; and we were happy to get the land per the tendered price. On the 9th August, 1971, a meeting was held in the Board Room of Faith Methodist Church to get ourselves organised into the Methodist Church Toa Payoh Project Committee to do the Project.

Immediately after the Meeting, all efforts were put in to raise the necessary fund as well as to get the building plans ready for the construction of a church complex. We thank God for His rich blessing upon the Project. In spite of all sorts of problems, we were able to get the plans approved with all the listed amenities and facilities; and we were able to secure the required fund to do the Project.

Today, we can see the building almost completed testifying to the faithfulness of God and also to His own glory. We have received some \$900,000/- solid cash from local sources only, excluding gifts and donations from outside. We trust that when the Project is completed by the end of July, 1973, all the pledges will be fully honoured. In fact, many churches in Singapore, have gone beyond their pledges: some by \$5,000; \$10,000; and even \$20,000. Therefore we have the confidence that the \$1,000,000/- can be raised locally for the Project.

We are glad to share with you the plans made by the Commission on Evangelism to hold a series of Gospel Rallies on August 20 through 26, 1973, and a week-long Toa Payoh Children's Health Campaign organised by the Singapore District W.S.C.S. jointly. May we request you to pray for the Project, particularly its activities and programmes in the days ahead.

The official opening and the dedication service will have to be postponed until a local Congregation is formed to play host. The worshippers at the Methodist Church Centre at Lorong 7 are very anxious to join force with the Methodist Church Toa Payoh Project Committee to establish a strong Toa Payoh Methodist Church Congregation; and we thank God for their wonderful spirit. At present two full time pastors are engaged by the MCTPPC to carry out the Christian activities and programmes in Toa Payoh; and they need your prayers and support.

Lastly, may we request you to continue your support for the Project until the local Congregation is established and strong enough to take over full responsibilities of the Church in Toa Pavoh. Thank you.

May God continue to bless you and keep you.

TO SET YOU THINKING

"What will happen if we plan our evangelism project according to the insights we have now gained?'

Frankly, it may be that many among your present church-membership will leave the Church and that a few who are now completely outside the Church will join you'. 'You mean to say that as a result of this project we may in the end actually be fewer!! This was the end of a conversation about evangelism....Numbers and growth are important in God's arithmetic: not necessarily large and increasing numbers, but representative numbers and growth in grace....The key question is not how the churches can grow numerically, but how they can grow in grace and so become God's representative number." (Hans-Ruedi Weber)

The love of the church-community means that we ought to take one another on for better or for worse, for always. And a member who continues long in sickness or disability will test the Church to the uttermost. To undertake intercession for a sick man may mean we have to see the family through a difficult time. We may have to see the man's widow and children through their adjustment to life after his death - not just spiritually, but materially too. Every member of the congregation will be the better or the worse for accepting or refusing responsibility. Intercession will not merely demand this of us, but will do this to us." (Michael Wilson)

given. In short, nobody can affirm, "The whole of my life is subject to God's will and purpose - except that part in which I have to fulfil my obligations as a citizen." What is Caesar's is also God's!

Lord Acton, the great historian, wrote of this cryptic saying of Jesus: "Those words ... gave to the civil power, under the protection of conscience, a sacredness it had never enjoyed and bounds it had never acknowledged, and they were the repudiation of absolutism and the inauguration of freedom." At one and the same time, they assert the rights of the state and the total claim of God.

We cannot compartmentalise our lives in the way so often suggested. "Religion" is not, for the Christian, part of his life but the whole of it. Christ did not come that we might have religion and have it more abundantly! - though, alas, we sometimes behave as though we thought this was what he had said. Let us then, as National Day approaches, dedicate ourselves as Christian Citizens to the great task of fulfilling God's plan for Singapore society, working with the government to create a free, just, disciplined community in which all shall have equal opportunity, all shall have their basic needs satisfied, and all shall live together and work together in harmony and peace.

We are grateful to our hardworking Anniversary Committee for the way in which they are preparing for our 16th Anniversary, and enclose an appeal letter from them asking members and friends to subscribe for a 'brick' towards our proposed church extension plans.

At the Anniversary Dinner itself, we hope to be able to present complete architect's plans for the project and to launch a full-scale Fund Raising Drive to finance it. A Church Extension Appeal Committee is being formed to plan and spear-head this, but it will need the strenuous and dedicated efforts of all of us to make our dreams come true.
