PASTOR'S MESSAGE

TWO-WAY CONVERSATION

The best kind of conversation, suggests Dr. Erik Routley in his little book "Into a far Country", is like two or three people sending one another rather difficult catches with a ball, each in turn throwing the other catching and returning it, at fairly high speed. In good conversation every participant is alert to what the others are saying, and to some extent anticipates it. Yet at every moment each is immediately adaptable, so that each new throw each new point made, finds him ready to receive it. It is a two-way game.

Nothing kills conversation so quickly as one 'player' becomes inattentive or stops trying to 'catch' the ball when it is thrown. The moment one relaxes the effort to understand or refuses to shift position to one where it is possible to receive what is being said, the game comes to a dead end. Turn your back on the thrower and the ball lands on the ground!

Similarly conversation becomes impossible when one participant says, "I'll throw: you catch." (It happens with preaches, doesn't it? But also with parents and teachers dealing with children! Would it not be more profitable to teach children to catch the ball and throw it back, even if we have to send them easy catches?) such a person does not wait to ask what information is needed or what the interests of the other person are: he pours out endless information, regardless! He tells people the answers before he has listened to the question. In short, he is a bore (and most of all when he can talk of nothing but himself).

Information alone cripples conversation because you can't throw the ball back. All you can say is, "Oh" or "Is that so?"

or "How interesting!" when somebody tells you "That's the City Hall" and "There's the padang" and "This is Clifford Pier". There's a take-it-or-leave-it kind of situation, quite different from the give-and-take of real meeting between persons. We become students in the lecture room, slavishly taking down notes of the professor's opinions, but wishing that we felt less like empty bottles being filled with water.

Conversation - the encounter between two or more persons - includes expression and response, and perhaps also command and decision. It is not necessary (indeed it can deaden the whole interchange) for either the expression or the command to be completely detailed and explicit for every 'i' to be dotted and every 't' crossed. Much is taken for granted, much is implied, for room must be left for a genuine response, the throwing back of the ball which enables the 'game' to go on.

And as I think of these things, I am pursuaded that this is the way God deals with us. He does not simply instruct or command: he invites us to join Him in conversation, he speaks and awaits our response. He treats us as persons in fact. He hints, he suggests, he challenges, he says: "Son of man, stand upon your feet and I will speak with you:" "Come" "Follow." Perhaps he always speaks to us "in parables", as Jesus did: wondering what we will make of what he says and what we will do about it. He made us "responsible" people - needing to pay attention but able to respond.

M.Y.F. SUNDAY Sunday 19th August saw our Youth, inspired the Holy Spirit, impart a very vital and important message - the message on Proyer; and what was revealed to you on MYF Sunday is not to be lightly taken. I hope that you grasped the reality of what was depicted and with the help of the Spirit you will move towards the correct way to PRAY.
