#### MORE MYSELF THAN EVER - FOR EVER

When archaeologists began to excavate Roman cemeteries, they discovered that nearly all the grave markers had seven letters carved on them - NF F NS NC. The bare initials were enough for any Roman to understand what was meant; 'non fui', 'fui', 'non sum', 'non curo' - "I was not", "I was", "I am not", "I do not care"... the ancient world needed only seven letters to sum up the whole futility of human life and the finality of death.

But Easter has transformed all that. "Now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the first fruits of them that slept .... Even so in Christ shall all be made alive". And that all means you and me; we shall be made alive, and death will not be the end of us.

I do not think we have been given a blueprint for the life ahead; but we can be sure that the God who gave us life intends us to keep that life forever, and that He who made us each a particular, peculiar individuality intends us to keep that uniqueness for ever.

That's what the creed means when we say, "I believe in ....the resurrection of the body." Not this body, of course. Everything that is now my body, as I write this, will be dead in seven years; but what it means is that I am not just going to disappear into some dim, shapeless 'spirit-cloud'. I am, because of my relationship with the Living Christ, going to go on being me for ever.

My body is very important here and now. In fact, without it you would not know me at all. I would not be able to share

"I CAN NEVER GET HOLD OF THE PASTOR!"



these few simple thoughts with you if I had not got hands to strike these typewriter keys and to get the duplicator working. I could talk to you, of course, but not without a mouth — and you could not receive these ideas of mine if you had no physical ears, with their cunning and wonderful mechanism. It is only through a body that we can communicate with each other, relate to one another and remain individuals, different and distinct from one another.

That is what it is like, the Bible tells us, in the life to come. We were never meant to be single, isolated units related only to God. We were meant for each other - always and always - and we are going to be provided by God with a special kind of body so that we shall always be able to communicate with, and relate to, one another - persons understanding and enjoying each other.

The Bible doesn't speak much about 'the immortality of the soul', an though this was our natural destiny or right. Rather, it promises that God will give us a new kind of body for a new, more complete kind of life; and rests this promise upon the fact that Jesus Christ was made known as risen from the dead.

what will we be like in the life to come? Again, we must not speculate too much. The body we now have - that, as I have said, is going to decay, die and disappear. But Paul reminds us of the analogy of the seed in the gorund and the flower of a plant. "What you sow," he says, "does not come to life without dying first. You do not plant the future flower; you plant a seed (that does not look a bit like what is going to come), and God gives it a new body as he chooses." And he goes on to say that the God who created all kinds of bodies, both living creatures and the stars in their courses, is going to find a way in the life to come for us each one to be ourselves.

And if that makes you ask the natural question, "Will we know each other there?" I am pretty sure I can answer, with a great deal of conviction, Yes! Because I believe firmly that in the world to come, I will be more myself. I will more and more become my full self, which in this life I have not fully become. And that will be true of each of us. And since love is eternal and since individuality is eternal, and since we are what we are so much because of our relations with other people, we can assume (as indeed we are promised) that we shall be known and we shall know. We shall be launched on the exciting adventure of beoming more ourselves than ever - and of getting to know each other better and better. And there will be eternity to do it in:
