PASTOR'S MESSAGE

MARCH 1975

"...AND TWO OTHERS WITH HIM ..."

Jesus did not die alone. The authorities saw to that! They nailed him to the cross with condemned criminals on either side of him. If it was their idea to publicise his shame, the plan misfired; they only succeeded in emphasising the depth and breadth of love divine. For in that public place of the world's rejection, a man at his execution found for himself God's acceptance and mercy.

"Don't you fear God?" said one criminal to the other. "We are all under the same sentence. Ours, however, is only right, because we are getting what we deserve for what we did; but he has done no wrong." And he said to Jesus, "Remember me, Jesus, when you come as King!" Jesus said to him, "I tell you this: today you will be in Paradise with me." (Luke 23:40ff)

I think of these things today, because at six o'clock this morning, seven men were hanged for murder. Two of them I knew as friends, and I want to share parts of letters that David and Andrew wrote to me at Christmastime; for we were able to rejoice this afternoon in the knowledge that God has fulfilled his promises to them both:

"In humility and repentance we ask your forgiveness for the shame we have publicly put upon the Holy Name of our Lord Jesus, and the shame we have brought upon the Lord's Body, His Church. This will be our last Christmas, but we go to join the Lord in His glorious kingdom and love. I want to reassure you that every day we spend here has been one of tremendous spiritual joy in that we had the honour and privilege of serving the Lord. We have prayed much, in agony and pain, that we may be given the joy of entering more of the Lord's mission fields; but the Lord has instead required that we testify for him in our homecoming - so in this we praise the Lord. We have no fear. The Lord is sustaining (John 6:33)

Trinity Theological College is eager to share in the lay-train ing programme of the local churches, and has prepared a course of study which would provide laymen with an opportunity to do some basic theological study.

Courses lasting for six weeks each, meeting once a week for approximately two hours, will introduce:

Old Testament New Testament Christian Faith Christian Life The Mission of the Church Church History and those completing six courses will be awarded a certificate by the College.

Each course will be offered three times a year: January-March, April-June and September-November: they will conducted in the local churches by invitation, by leaders provided by the College.

If there is a group in our own congregation who would wish to share in this kind of training, we would be glad to negotiate further with the Trinity College organisers.

Are YOU interested? If so, please give your name to the pastor or to Mr Chan Chong Hiok, Chairman of the Committee on Christian Education, as soon as possible. The sonner we gather a group, the higher up the waiting list we shall be!

Even after increases voted by the Annual Conference, the rate of pension paid to retired ministers is still only \$4 per month per year of service. This means that a minister who retired after 30 years of faithful service receives from the Pension Fund, in these inflationary times, a mere \$120 per month. (His surviving widow receives even less - \$84 per month). Out of the Board of Pensions \$33,000 budget for the year, pensions have to be paid for 35 retired pastors or their widows.

Conference has authorised the taking of a special offering to supplement this budget. Our Communion Offerings on Sunday 2 March will go to the Board of Pensions. Please give as generously as you can or send your contributions to our Church Treasurer.

"....You know when I was a teenager, I used to wonder about you guys in the Lord's service and often asked myself, "How do they manage? Don't they get tired of the work? Isn't being a minister of the Lord pretty dull?" I tell you! Now I know - the THRILL of it all! Now I know what it is to be moved by the Spirit - sustained by Him, encouraged by Him, pushed by Him! Sometimes I wonder how we ever managed! To teach them the hymns, so many of them; how we managed to preach the word - day in and day out, three times a day for two years Every time, whatever difficulty there may be. He opens the way. Now we know the meaning of Zechariah 4:6 "Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord of hosts".

"The word of the Lord, the Bible, is the most amazing book in the world, and the most wonderful book I have ever read. To read it and understand the language in print is one thing, but to read with spiritual vision and understanding is beyond description! The . hunger for the Word of the Lord is insatiable, and this is what is going to cure the world's hangover - the Lord Jesus and His word!!

"Rev. Smith, next time you counsel someone and he tells you that the Lord cannot cure him or help him or forgive him - tell him or her that if the Lord could and did cure and forgive me, his or her problem is chickenfeed by comparison! Now I have a little understanding of the word "the love of God which passes our understanding" (Ephes. 3:19) ...

"At our funeral, do these things for us: no black clothes, but gay, colourful ones; no grief, but joy in the victory of our Lord over sin in us, and that we are with Him; comfort my loved ones in the gope and assurance of our Lord's feturn, and commit our bodies to the Lord's resurrecting power.... So we say farewell and cry, "Maranatha! Maranatha! Maranatha!!" Till we meet again on the holy shores of our glorious Lord's eternal Kingdom."

Andrew and David were hanged this morning. This afternoon we sang for them, "How great Thou art!" and "There is sunshine in my soul today.", for these years of imprisonment have been gloriously used! And today I am certain they have heard the word of Jesus to the one whose condemnation He shared: "Today ... with me ... in Paradise." 'The dying thief rejoiced to see

That fountain in his day; And there may I, though vile as he. Wash all my sins away. O dying Lamb, Thy precious blood Shall never lose its power, Till all the ransomed church of God Be saved to sin no more.' (W. Copwer)
