Mortality and Immortality

fter I have heard people say that all of us have to come to terms with our mortality. That's true. Furthermore, I feel that we need to come to terms with our own IMMORTALITY! What's that? you say. That's true too. Man is both mortal and immortal. Physically we are mortal beings but spiritually we are immortal; our spirits will continue to exist, to live beyond our physical death.

EASTER is good time to come to terms with these two great forces in our lives, our mortality and immortality. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday help us to see that though death is inevitable, it is not something to be dreaded or feared. The Resurrection confirms our immortality that comes through Christ.

But our physical mortality and spirit's immortality needs to convince us of other important things as well. We need to be convinced that ALL people are mortal; they will also face death, and as far as we can help it they should not face death without Christ. We need to see that their spirits' immortality means that they will spend eternity with or without God, we have been put in a position to influence this. For their mortality is our mortality, but will their immortality be similar as well? Will they spend eternity with God?

Coming to terms with our immortality means that just as much as we, others need Christ in their lives as well. Easter proclaims very clearly the promise of a God-filled eternity. God wants us to proclaim this promise to others as well,

The Easter events are also EPIPHANY. They make clear God's purposes in mortality and immortality. They say that because we are mortal, we cannot afford to be without Christ in immortality. This is true for ALL persons. They need to know. They need Christ. They need us to tell them; to show them,

So if we want to capture the Spirit of Easter — we need to share Christ. One practical avenue is to become involved in the Reinhard Bonnke Mission this June. Be a counsellor, or usher, or intercessor; bring people to the Mission. Easter Sunday is the day we sign up to be personally involved. Our prayer is that YOU will be involved, too.

This is how we deal with our mortality and immortality, by helping others to do the same — through JESUS.

Christ has died. Christ is Risen. Christ will return.

BOOK REVIEW



Where were you when I was hurting By Nicky Cruz

n his latest book, Nicky Cruz, the author of "Run Baby Run", preaches the message of healing that comes when we are willing to give up our bitterness and our hurts and forgive those who hurt us. With vivid recollections of God's miracles and blessings, he shares with us his ministry of witnessing Jesus Christ to the bitter, the hurt, the poor, the unfortunate and the oppressed in the many countries he visited.

One particularly moving event in his ministry was when the Hungarian Government invited him to go to Budapest to help them fight their serious drug problem. Somehow government officials had read his book "Run Baby Run". As a condition of his going to Hungary, Nicky got the Hungarian Government to agree to print and distribute 35,000 copies of the Bible and 12,000 copies of his book "Run Baby Run". This was a phenomenal event in Hungary since it is a communist country with an atheist government and bureaucracy who had all along prevented Bibles and Christian books from reaching their people.

On the first night, Nicky preached to 3,500 government officials, doctors, social workers and others involved in the anti drug fight. The people were moved by his message about Christ and 1,100 of them accepted the Lord that night. He preached again to a crowd of 2,500 people on the second night with a TV recording crew. God healed a drug addict dying of drug abuse that night. The people were so moved by her testimony that 1,300 went up to the altar to accept Christ. The entire event was broadcast on TV. God had used Nicky's two days in Hungary to bring about a revival there.



MISSIONS


- 1) Establishing a Missions Statement/Policy.
