1988 will be the 250th Anniversary of John Wesley's 'heart-warming' Aldersgate experience. It will be an appropriate time to recapture the vision God gave him for a people called Methodists.

As we have emphasised renewal and service in the past year, I believe we will need to continue and maintain this emphasis in 1988. We need to consolidate the spiritual gains and progress the Spirit has enabled us to appropriate. It will be necessary to maintain the momentum and build on what has been done already.

The Theme and Scripture emphasise the importance of being God's people TOGETHER. Christianity is both a personal and corporate faith. We are Christians and we are also Church, And God has called us together as a Church precisely because this is His plan and method for the propogation of the Gospel of His Kingdom.

The Scripture text is Ecclesiological; that is, it is about the Church. To be mature Christians we need to play our part in the Body of Christ. Only through the Body of Christ can the Gospel be adequately spread. The Body of Christ can only do that effectively if we ALL play our part.

This is what is meant by 'Perfect Whole'; we use the word "perfect" on its original Greek sense (teleos) meaning mature or full grown, "Whole" speaks about the Church working TOGETHER. What we want to see is a Church maturing and operating effectively as one Body.

And so that is why our theme song is "Let Us Open Up Ourselves". This best enunciates a sound theology of the Church, It speaks about our relationship with God and with one another and how this is related to outreach as well as Christian maturity.

Surely, we want to become such a Church! We do not want merely a form of religion, without power. Instead it ought to be "The springs of living water flowing out of the fullness of our lives",

Therefore, our theme will emphasise that we all become involved in the life and service of the Church. We will then BECOME the kind of Church the Scriptures define,





On 23 January 1988, at the TEC Level 2, our sister Margaret Chan shared her thoughts in being a "woman of God" to 40 WSCS members. God was gracious to allow so many to seek Him and find out the roles He has for each of them.

Quoting from Proverbs 31 (verses 10 to 31) and her own experience as a wife and mother, Margaret urged those present to be:

- Committed to the husband/wife relationship As a wife, a woman not only sees to her husband's well-being but must also earn his praise and trust. She complements him so that together, they become stronger.
- Committed to the parent/child relationship
 As a mother, she teaches God's word and counsels
 her children. Happiness, warmth and the general
 well-being of the family are her goals.
- Committed to total self-development A woman should not neglect herself even as she attends to the family's needs. She keeps herself fit and well-groomed, learns useful skills, practises good judgement in investments but above all, remains truly devoted to God.

To be the kind of woman described in Proverbs 31 is indeed a challenge! Many of us fall far short of such an ideal; nevertheless, it is an ideal worth striving towards. Such a woman is "worth far more than rubies". (Proverbs 31 v 10).

Ginger Gabriel, who wrote the Bible Study Guide "Being a woman of God" describes her another way:

"She is the woman who has committed herself unreservedly to the Lord Jesus Christ and is in the process of becoming all that He wants her to be spiritually, intellectually, physically and socially. She is vibrant and alive because of the power of the Holy Spirit within her and the fruits of the Spirit give her a beautiful feminity that is uniquely her own. Her commitment to God blossoms out into commitment to her friends and, in most cases, to the man God has chosen for her life; and because the Holy Spirit's power flows through her, she is able to help those around her become more of what God has intended them to be as well."

Yes, the woman has a special role in God's sovereign plan! I believe it is when she allows her life to be ordered in accordance to this plan that she will find the deepest satisfaction, joy and fulfillment in life.


